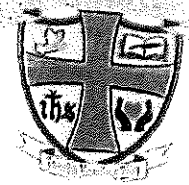

Choose One of the following books to read during the Summer. Enjoy!
(All descriptions of novels come from SAPL website, or Book depository website)

Escape from Mr. Lemoncello's Library by Chris Grabenstein (Grades 4-8)

"Twelve-year-old Kyle gets to stay overnight in the new town library, designed by his hero (the famous gamemaker Luigi Lemoncello), with other students but finds that come morning he must work with friends to solve puzzles in order to escape"

The Dark Lady by Irene Adler (Grades 5-8)

"While on summer vacation at the seaside, twelve-year-old Irene Adler meets the young Sherlock Holmes, and his friend Arsène Lupin—and when a dead body floats ashore the three young friends set out to solve the mystery."

Nightbird by Alice Hoffman (Grades 5-8)

"Twig, aged twelve, is practically ignored by classmates and other residents of Sidwell, Massachusetts, but gets along fine with just her mother and brother, whose presence must be kept secret, until descendants of the witch who cursed her family move in next door and want to be her friends."

King of Shadows by Susan Cooper (Grades 5-8)

"While in London as part of an all-boy acting company preparing to perform in a replica of the famous Globe Theatre, Nat Field suddenly finds himself transported back to 1599 and performing in the original theater under the tutelage of Shakespeare himself."

Steal Away by Jennifer Armstrong (Grades 5-8)

"Two girls— one African-American, one white — escape north together during the Civil War." "A distinctive tale of courage and sacrifice."

After you read the book, please do the following:

1. In your first paragraph, tell what book you read, the author, copyright date, and publisher. Tell what you enjoyed most about the book, and include one quote from the book and the page number that it is on that helps to show how good the book is.
2. In your next paragraph explain how this book compares with another or other books you have read. Include another quote in this paragraph with the page it is on that helps to explain your comparison.
3. In your next paragraph tell who is your favorite character from the book. Explain why you like this character. Include two quotes from the book and the page number they are on that help to explain why you liked this character.
4. In your last paragraph tell who you think would like to read this book. Rate the book from one star to 5 stars (one being the least and five being the best) and explain why you gave the particular number of stars to the book.

RUBRIC FOR SUMMER READING

Title of the book , author, publisher and copyright date are in the opening paragraph.

All parts of the stated requirements are present in the paper.

Ideas are clearly worded, quotes clearly support stated ideas.

Paper is organized into paragraphs; details are placed in logical order.

The main idea of each paragraph is clear.

The vocabulary chosen is appropriate, vivid and clear. Students are specific in their language and do not rely on generalizations.

Spelling, capitalization, and punctuation are correct.

Sentence structure is is grammatically correct; sentences are complete without sentence fragments or run on sentences.
