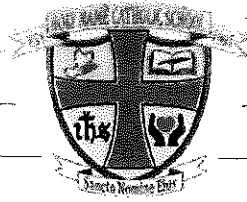

Dear Future First Grade Parents,

Summer is a wonderful time for fun and relaxation. It's a time for trips and activities you and your family may not get around to during a busy school year. We'd like to add an activity to your summer plans for your future first grader. Each grade level at Holy Name will be participating in a summer reading program. This reading program includes reading two books and completing activities to accompany each book. With this in mind, I'm going to require a couple of books for you to read with your child, as well as some activities for your child to do that are related to the books. This will be a good way to keep your child engaged in reading, and hopefully get your child excited about the year to come.

The books I am requiring for summer reading are both by the famous Dr. Seuss, whose childrens' books are so well-known and much loved.

1. The Giving Tree by Shel Silverstein- This is a book sweet book about giving and taking. I often read it to the children at the beginning of the year and we do some activities. It will be a good idea to give them a preview.

Activities: Please read this book to your child, or have your child read this book. Then, fold a piece of drawing paper in half. On one side, have your child draw a picture of something the tree gave the boy. On the other, have him/her draw something the boy could have given the tree. Make sure each side is labeled. If your child is able, have him or her write a short sentence on each side describing the drawing.

2. Green Eggs and Ham by Dr. Seuss- This is a classic book first published in August of 1960 and read by generations of children. Not only is it great for reinforcing the concept of rhyme, it has a wide variety of sight words in it that the children should be at least slightly familiar with.

Activities: Please read this to your child or have your child read it. After reading, discuss with your child the idea that it's always good to try something new, since they might actually like the item they're reluctant to try. Then help your child make a list of words that rhyme with each other. The words can be in pairs or there can be a longer list. Next, have your child illustrate something that happens at the beginning of the story, something that happens in the middle of the story, and something that happens at the end of the story. Have your child label or number each section.

There are other books you may wish to share with your child. Here are a few suggestions: The Berenstain Bears books by Stan and Jan Berenstain, the Clifford books by Norman Bridwell, the Flat Stanley books by Jeff M. Brown. If You Give a Mouse a Cookie has a series too. It's by Laura Joffe Numeroff.

I'm going to attach a reading log. Please help your child keep track of books that he/she reads. If the reading log is turned in with a list of books read, there'll be a prize given in the first few days of school. I look forward to meeting you and your child in August.
